I and my musician So are pleased to announce that we have been invited by the international theatre director Eugenio Barba to participate in the ISTA.

ISTA is a travelling school that takes place in different parts of the world. This time, it was held in Hungary for two weeks, from 7-21 May.

I have not yet assembled the main data from the video and photographs taken by our specialist documentary photographer.

For the time being, as a greeting on my return, I have compiled an "ISTA in Hungary Travel Diary", mainly with photos I took myself.

At the training camp in Pécsvárad in the Hungarian countryside, Eugenio Barba's analysis presented the core of the diverse performing arts, and based on these studies and experiences, the rehearsals of 《ANASTASIS Resurrection》 were repeated. All of ISTA, the group then travelled to the capital, Budapest, to participate in the Theatre Olympics at the National Theatre.

I plan to write a report on the event once I have the video and photographic data taken by a specialist documentary photographer.

In ANASTASIS, masters of traditional performing arts from various countries, young students and researchers who aspire to theatre, diverse cultures intermingled and created a new harmony.

I am happy to report that a beautiful flower of world peace bloomed on that stage.

Beginning of ISTA in Hungary 2023

White flowers, like the Japanese 'Kodemari', border the garden. The town can be seen in the distance.












Rooms on the first three floors of this building are workshop venues.

Kamigata-mai Performance

15 May (Mon) 19:30.

There is a lovely theatre in town, a 20-minute bus ride from the accommodation.

Every evening there, performances are given by ISTA masters.

Today I gave a Kamigata-mai performance.

The programs were "Yashima" and "Yuki". The shamisen music was by So Sugiura.

In the overseas performances, I change on stage into the costume for Yuki after Yashima.

This style was initiated by Eugenio Barba at the women's theatre festival TRANSIT organized by Julia in Holstebro, Denmark, about 10 years ago. In Japan, it would be unthinkable to change costumes in front of an audience at a Japanese dance performance.

After a lot of rehearsal and failure it became a part of my Kamigata-mai performance and could be enjoyed by the audience.

Julia says that this scene is very good, and that it is interesting to see how I, a tiny little person, become so big when I finish putting on my 'Yuki' costume.

Two assistants are needed for this on-stage change of clothes.

I have been working with Viviana from Spain for almost seven years, with many rehearsals and many real stage experiences. I now feel comfortable leaving her to help me with the dressing.

This time, in addition to Viviana, Natasha from the USA was my assistant.

I would like to thank them both for their diligence in assisting me.





Final greetings Reunion


On Sunday 21 May, I finally returned home.

TANKA is a traditional Japanese form of poetry, consisting of 31 syllables. It is also known as WAKA or UTA. I like to make tanka and haiku poems. I compose poems about the Japanese heart with nature in each of the four seasons.

《ANASTASIS/Resurrection》 Overview

Composed and directed by Eugenio Barba

Anástasis depicts Life's different phases and realities from birth to death and again re-birth in the world of nature, animals and humans. Anástasis is a hymn to the power of Life and an homage to the performer's art with its splendour of styles and expressions. It is enacted by performers from different countries and traditions: Japanese Noh, Chinese Nanguan Opera, Balinese Topeng, Indian Baul and Kathakali, Brazilian Cavalo Marinho and Bumba Meu Boi, Flamenco and western contemporary styles.

Synopsis

1. Welcoming the spectators

Two clowns, Mr. Peanut and the Balinese Penasar, lead the spectators to their places.

2. Introduction

A Transylvanian song in darkness.

3. Presentation of the performance

Two storytellers, an Indian Baul and a Brazilian folk singer, inform the spectators about the events to happen.

4. The power of nature

A Japanese woman admires the beauty of the landscape, while Death looms.

5. The family

A father (Pulcinella), a mother (Nanguan Opera) and a Brazilian child (Cavalo Marinho) play in the intimacy of domestic life.

6. Human weakness

The Baul storyteller shows the greed of an old man (Balinese Topeng).

7. Brazilian feast

A group of joyful people celebrates the vitality of a bull.

8. Showing off bravery

The Brazilian singer and a Hungarian traditional dancer display their virtuosity.

9. The feast ends

The bull is killed, while the family admires the landscape.

10. People are hungry...

Two clowns (Bali and Brazil) find the dead bull and carry it out to have a good meal.

11. ... and rich people dance

An elegant couple on stilts waltzes to Johann Strauss' music.

12. The boy's funeral

The parents mourn the dead son.

13. The face of darkness

An Indian Kathakali demon attempts to annihilate the child's corpse.

14. The transformation of Death into Life

The bull and the child resurrect and the performance ends with Death becoming Life, among the actors singing a traditional Hungarian song ("By the river of Tisza under an almond tree / two lovers embrace each other").
